

Depression Photography, 25 pts

As with any subject, there are many ways to analyze the Great Depression. Historians typically pay the most attention to the economic causes & consequences of the Great Depression, as well as the political consequences. But with an event as monumental as the Great Depression the human consequences are more fundamental and significant important than either the economic or political shifts. To understand the human element, we will be consulting some of the most powerful primary sources of the Depression—photographs.

PHOTO ANALYSIS PROCEDURE

1. Individually, you will visit the web sites below, and complete the following:
 - Look through all of the images for both Dorothea Lange & Walker Evans;
 - Choose at least **two** images for **each** photographer;
 - Choose the pictures you feel are most powerful; and
 - Focus primarily on photos with human subjects;
 - Analyze the pictures you chose using the following format, for each.
